21ST CENTURY IDOLS by: Rev. Patrick Ezimora, CCE

PART I

"Worship the Lord your God, and serve only Him" (Luke 4:8)

In my opinion, and speaking from a religious standpoint, to give cult or to adore means to deeply admire God for who He is, namely the "First and the Last Being", the "One who is in Himself, without depending on another". Worship is rightly given to God because He is almighty, eternal, infinite, immutable, ineffable, mysterious, immortal, and glorious. Moreover, God is adored and revered for his love, goodness, mercy, wisdom, holiness, justice, truthfulness, uprightness, faithfulness, and fatherliness. These mentioned qualities, among several others, make God genuinely adorable. Besides, with so many superhuman, supernatural qualities, it should be only right and just to adore, admire and revere God. In addition, the adoration of God, the supreme Being, requires that the adorer offer the oblation (complete and total offering) of one's whole being: body, mind, heart, will, affection, strength, talent, treasure, and time. It is analogous to one who finds an invaluable treasure (perhaps a ton of gold or diamond) hidden in some distant land. What would you do if you were to get so lucky? I guess you would do something 'crazy', such as gather your most valuable possessions and sell them instantaneously, even if family and friends do not agree. You may even go ahead and get some loan if necessary, to purchase that invaluable piece of land (without, of course, disclosing your secret to the seller).

This very conscious act of gathering the best goods at one's disposition and selling them to buy that treasure-containing piece of land is equivalent to the act of worship. The religious human being is one who recognizes the inestimable treasure that God is in their lives. For this reason, they offer their Lord the best gifts (spirit, soul, and body). Adoration is a natural call within rational creatures. Human beings naturally perceive the existence and activity of God. But perhaps, most importantly, human persons perceive that they are radically dependent on God. In fact, to be free indeed, freedom needs to guit the arena of self-referentiality. Moreover, when it is fully mature, freedom acknowledges and respects its right autonomy as much as its true limits. For, if we are beings in time or better, timed beings, we naturally intuit our limitations. Yet, humanity also enjoys the power of self-determination, an ability powered by man's natural spiritual faculties: the power to know (mind), to love (heart), to understand (intellect), to explore (reason), to remember (memory), to desire (will), to feel (conscience) and to be free (freedom). All these abilities or capacities define the essence of the human person.

IDOLOS DEL SIGLO XXI por: Rev. Patrick Ezimora, CCE

PARTE I "Adora al Señor, tu Dios, y sírvele sólo a Él" (Lucas 4:8)

En mi opinión, y hablando desde un punto de vista religioso, dar culto o adorar significa admirar profundamente a Dios por lo que es, a saber, el "Primer y el Último Ser", el "que es en Sí mismo, sin depender de otro". Se rinde culto a Dios con razón porque Él es todopoderoso, eterno, infinito, inmutable, inefable, misterioso, inmortal y glorioso. Además, Dios es adorado y reverenciado por su amor, bondad, misericordia, sabiduría, santidad, justicia, veracidad, rectitud, fidelidad y paternidad. Estas cualidades mencionadas, entre otras muchas, hacen a Dios genuinamente adorable. Además, con tantas cualidades sobrehumanas y sobrenaturales, debería ser justo y correcto adorar, admirar y reverenciar a Dios. Además, la adoración de Dios, el Ser supremo, requiere que el adorador ofrezca la oblación (ofrenda completa y total) de todo su ser: cuerpo, mente, corazón, voluntad, afecto, fuerza, talento, tesoro y tiempo. Es análogo a quien encuentra un tesoro de valor incalculable (tal vez una tonelada de oro o de diamantes) escondido en alguna tierra lejana. ¿Qué haría usted si tuviera tanta suerte? Supongo que harías alguna "locura", como reunir tus posesiones más valiosas y vend-erlas al instante, aunque la familia y los amigos no estén de acuerdo. Incluso podrías adelantarte y pedir algún préstamo, si fuera necesario, para comprar ese pedazo de tierra de valor incalculable (por supuesto, sin revelar tu secreto al vendedor).

Este mismo acto consciente de reunir los mejores bienes de que uno dispone y venderlos para comprar ese pedazo de tierra que contiene un tesoro equivale al acto de adoración. El ser humano religioso es aquel que reconoce el tesoro inestimable que es Dios en su vida. Por eso, ofrece a su Señor los mejores dones (espíritu, alma y cuerpo). La adoración es una llamada natural dentro de las criaturas racionales. El ser humano percibe con naturalidad la existencia y la actividad de Dios. Pero quizá, lo más importante, las personas humanas perciben que dependen radicalmente de Dios. De hecho, para ser realmente libre, la libertad necesita abandonar el terreno de la autorreferencialidad. Además, cuando es plenamente madura, la libertad reconoce y respeta su justa autonomía tanto como sus verdaderos límites. Pues, si somos seres en el tiempo o, mejor, seres cronometrados, intuimos naturalmente nuestras limitaciones. Sin embargo, la humanidad también disfruta del poder de autodeterminación, una capacidad potenciada por las facultades espirituales naturales del hombre: el poder de conocer (mente), de amar (corazón), de comprender (intelecto), de explorar (razón), de recordar (memoria), de desear (voluntad), de sentir (conciencia) y de ser libre (libertad). Todas estas habilidades o capacidades definen la esencia de la persona humana.

July 26: Saints Joachim and Anne—Memorial



Today we honor the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the grandparents of Jesus. Their names are not recorded in the Gospels but first come to us from a mid-second-century apocryphal document called the Gospel of James. Though this "gospel" has been determined to be inauthentic, it is the earliest record we have of the Blessed Mother's parents. At the very least, we

can presume that their names are correct: Joachim and Anne. Other apocryphal literature, such as the Gospel of the Nativity of Mary and the Gospel of Pseudo-Matthew, also contain uncertain information about these holy parents and grandparents. Pray to this holy couple today, especially asking their intercession for your grandparents or your grandchildren. Ponder what it would have been like to give birth to the Mother of the Son of God. Prayerfully imagine what it would have been like to watch their daughter, who was "full of grace," grow and mature into adulthood. Though these holy parents might not have understood all of the mysteries that surrounded their daughter, they would have known, by a grace of spiritual intuition, that their daughter was chosen by God and given a singular grace that budded forth in an abundance of virtue for all to see, especially for her parents to see.

Saints Joachim and Anne, you were given the incredible privilege and responsibility to give birth to and raise the Immaculate Conception, the Mother of God. Her presence in your lives touched you both deeply and left you in awe of God's grace. Please pray for me, that I may come to love your daughter and your Grandson with the same love you bore for each of them, so that I will enjoy their company in Heaven one day, just as you do today. St. Thomas Aquinas was canonized 700 years ago



St. Thomas Aquinas was highly regarded for this sanctity and intelligence during his life, but was more widely appreciated after his death. It didn't take too long for the Church to hold-up St. Thomas as an example to follow and to canonize him a saint. He was officially canonized on July 18, 1323, by Pope John XXII, only 49 years after his death. Vatican News reported that Pope Francis wrote a letter in Latin commemorating Aquinas' canonization, "describing him as 'a man of the Church,' priest and doctor who shared his "great spiritual and human wisdom" through prayers and writings.
