Dear parishioners of STA Parish,

On this 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, our Lord explains the mystery of the kingdom of heaven with the parable of the ten bridesmaids (Matthew 25.1-13). I wonder which part of the story captured your attention. For me, it is the "flasks of oil" and the "no" of the wise bridesmaids. The extra oil seems to be the virtue of **hope** because "we are **saved by our hope**" (Romans 8:24) and it is hope that keeps the fire of love alive. Moreover, wisdom requires us to **not compromise on certain matters**, such as religious and moral values. We must have courage to say "no" when God and our faith in Him are at stake. ALL ABOUT FAITH

November 16: Saint Gertrude the Great—Memorial



Saint Gertrude the Great is the only female saint to be given the title "the Great," which Pope Benedict XIV bestowed on her in the mid-eighteenth century as a way of highlighting her extraordinary contribution to mystical theology. Nothing is known about Gertrude's early childhood or family origin, other than that she was born in Eisleben, Thuringia, in the Holy Roman Empire, modern-day Germany. At the

age of five, she was entrusted to the Monastery of Saint Mary in the neighboring town of Helfta, which was later moved to Hackeborn property. Why she entered the convent at such a young age is not known. Most likely, either her parents offered their daughter to God in this thencustomary way, or Gertrude might have been an orphan.

Saint Gertrude was never formally canonized, and her writings were nearly lost until they were discovered centuries after her death. In the seventeenth century, she was honored by the Church and received an "equivalent" canonization. In the eighteenth century she was placed on the Universal Roman Calendar, and her prayers and revelations began to be more widely known. It might be that God especially wanted to use her to reveal His inner life to the Church today, many centuries after her death. Consider learning more about this mystic and her writings so that God can infuse you with some of the same insights and grace He gave to her.

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the Universal Church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen. Saint Gertrude the Great and Saint Matilda, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.— My Catholic Life

What do they care about earthly honous when their heavenly Father honors them by fulfilling the faithful promise of the Son? What does our commendation mean to them? The saints have no need of honor from us; neither does our devotion add the slightest thing to what is theirs.

God Loves a Paradox



God loves a paradox. The Trinity is three Persons in One God. The King of the World was born in a stable. "I am with you always," Jesus tells His Apostles right before the Ascension (Matthew 28:20). He tells his disciples "The greatest among you must be your servant" (Matthew 23:11) and "Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 10:39).

And in a deep ravine in rural New York, this last paradox takes concrete shape. This ravine is deep shades of green, a quiet stream trickling nearby. The only sounds are natural ones. This ravine exudes a holy peace.

The quiet, beautiful, peaceful ravine is, in reality, a messy, ugly, violent way of the Cross. It is, in itself, the paradox of discipleship: "Whoever loses their life for my sake will find it."
