



ALL ABOUT FAITH

December 6: Saint Nicholas



Saint Nicholas of Myra, also known as Nicholas of Bari, Nicholas the Wonderworker, and Saint Nick, was a fourth-century bishop in Myra, Asia Minor, modern-day Demre, Turkey. His life is also the origin of the legend of Santa Claus. By the sixth century, his tomb had become widely venerated because of the numerous reported miracles worked through his intercession. In the eleventh century, his

body was transferred to Bari, Italy, where it remains today. To this day, his bodily remains excrete a liquid, at first thought to be an oil but now believed to be water, which is collected, mixed with holy water, and distributed to the faithful in bottles every May 9, the day his remains arrived in Bari. The liquid is commonly referred to as the "Manna of Saint Nicholas" and is believed to contain miraculous healing power. For this reason, along with the mythical character of Santa Claus, he remains a highly venerated saint within the Church.

As we honor this saintly bishop from 1,700 years ago, ponder the faith of the people of God throughout those centuries who have benefitted from the sacred art, pilgrimages to his tomb, and the miraculous Manna of Saint Nicholas. Allow the longtime devotion to him to inspire you, entrusting yourself more fully to his intercession, as well as the intercession of all the saints of Heaven.

Saint Nicholas, through your intercession, God has touched many lives. The legends of your life have inspired faith throughout the centuries, just as your priestly and episcopal ministry impacted the people of your day. Please pray for me, that I will become a true saint and fulfill the mission God has given to me. Saint Nicholas of Myra, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You. — My Catholic Life

Have you ever tried making an Advent resolution?



The season of Advent is similar to Lent, a penitential time when we can make resolutions to live closer to Christ. Advent is a beautiful time of the year and is similar to Lent in many ways. We can practice similar spiritual practices, such as making a Lenten resolution, including various sacrifices and commitments to increase spiritual activity. Such spiritual resolutions might include giving up chocolate for Lent, or engaging in almsgiving during the penitential season.

Advent is also meant to be a season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. While Catholics are not often encouraged to make resolutions during Advent, the liturgical season is meant to be a time to prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus at Christmas. As an example, beginning in the 8th century Eastern Christians doubled down on their preparations for Christmas. They firmly believed in the ancient maxim, "fast before you feast," and followed Christ's example of fasting for 40 days in the desert before he began his public ministry. To properly prepare for the glorious celebration of Christmas on December 25, they fasted for 40 days, beginning November 15 and ending on Christmas Eve.

Pope: Art reflects communion between God and humanity



The Pope went on to recall that the Holy See adopted a law in 2001 to safeguard its own cultural assets. He said the regulation would soon be updated to "correspond effectively to changed historical and social conditions, as well as to the evolution of both internal legislation and that of international organizations." Citing Pope Benedict XVI, Pope Francis said the Church has "always supported and promoted the world of art, considering its language a privileged vehicle for human and spiritual progress."

Art, he added, is a tangible sign of the "transitus Domini" in the world, that is, "a visible expression of the life of the Church in its liturgical action and in the proclamation of the faith, in various spiritual manifestations, and in the exercise of charity."
