

Memorial: St Gregory of Narek - February 27



Gregory's father had taught him to remain in a state of continuous dialogue with God, ever attentive to His divine presence. The Book of Narek seems to flow from Gregory's ongoing dialogue. The book is a

compilation of ninety-five prayers. Each prayer begins with the phrase, "Speaking with God from the Depths of the Heart." The prayers then go on to express the deepest love of God by a soul that seems troubled, and even tormented at times. The torment, however, is not despair, but an interior expression of hope from a soul who is in touch with his fallen humanity and sin, while at the same time keenly aware of God's mercy. Saint Gregory states that these prayers were written "by the finger of God" (Prayer 34) and that Gregory saw God, as he says, "with my own eyes" (Prayer 27f).

Prepare the earth for the day of light and let the soil bloom and bring forth fruit, heavenly cup of life-giving blood, ever sacrificed, never running dry all for the salvation and life of the souls in eternal rest. And though my body die in sin, with Your grace and compassion, may I be strengthened in You, cleansed of sin through You, and renewed by You with life everlasting, and at the resurrection of the righteous be deemed worthy of Your Father's blessing. To Him together with You, all glory, and with the Holy Spirit, praise and resounding thanks, now, always and forever,

Second Sunday of Lent: Contrast



The Gospel for today's Mass presents us with the Transfiguration of our Lord, which took place on a mountain where Jesus offered a small glimpse of His glory to three of His apostles: Peter, James, and John. This story begins with similarities to Jesus' forty days in the desert. Jesus took these three apostles away by themselves for a time of solitude. They didn't journey into the desert, but they did climb a mountain, which was undoubtedly laborious.

What these apostles would encounter on that mountain was far from a desert experience of hunger, thirst, heat, and temptation. Instead, in what must have seemed a surreal and instantaneous flash of grace, Moses and Elijah appeared and were speaking to Jesus. Jesus Himself became radiant with light, His clothing dazzling white. Then the Voice of the Father thundered from Heaven. Not only were the eyes of these apostles dazzled, but their spirits were also stirred, for they knew they were seeing something they could have never imagined seeing. They were receiving the consoling gift of a glimpse of Jesus' glory.

Did the Demons Know Jesus was God?



Demons do not know everything. While they are extremely intelligent beings—far smarter than even the highest IQ human beings-still they are not aware of all that takes place in the material world. This raises the thorny question of whether the demons knew that Jesus was God. Interestingly, the Church Father Origen observed that God allowed Mary's marriage to Joseph to conceal from the devil the miraculous conception of Jesus. In this way, the protective presence of Joseph helped mislead the demons into thinking Jesus had been born of flesh and blood just like any other human being. Nevertheless, we can be sure that over time the demons' fascination with Jesus would have grown. Exorcists point out that the demons are especially attentive to the life and deeds of holy people, and appeared to have never committed any sin.
