THIS WEEK AT ST. THOMAS AQUINAS

From the Associate Pastor's Desk

"You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." St. Augustine's Confessions (Lib 1,1-2,2.5,5: CSEL 33, 1-5). Since it is God who has put in every human being, the innate desire or thirst for Him, then, only Him alone can satisfy or quench such desire or thirst. (cf. Psalms 42 1-2). The water that the Israelites thirsted for and received in the wilderness was a foreshadow of the Living Water we hear in the Gospel, precisely in the dialogue between Jesus Christ and the Samaritan woman (cf. Matthew 25: 34-40), we can attain that satisfaction we thirst and desire for, here on earth. Memorial: St. John of God — March 8



Reflection: Saint John of God was born in the village of Montemor-o-Novo, Portugal to middle-class, faith-filled parents. According to his early biographer, John was abducted from his home when he was only

eight years old and taken to the town of Oropesa, Spain, more than 200 miles away. In Oropesa, John found himself homeless and alone. He met a good man named El Mayoral who gave him a job as a shepherd and a place to live. John worked hard until he was twenty-two years old, never returning to his parents' home. El Mayoral wanted John to marry his daughter, but John wanted to see the world. He joined the army of the Holy Roman Emperor and battled the French. During his service, he was assigned to guard some captured clothing that went missing. John was accused of theft and condemned to death, but others intervened and he was released. Frustrated with military life, John returned to El Mayoral's farm where he worked for another four years before entering the army once again to fight the Turks for the next eighteen years.

Saint John of God, you struggled in many ways throughout your life. Through it all, you never gave up your desire to serve God and others. Please pray for me, especially when I lose hope, that I may imitate your example and offer myself to God for His glory and the service of all. Saint John of God, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You. Amen. —My Catholic Life

Third Sunday of Lent: Living Water



Today's Gospel reading (John 4:5–42) is the touching and tender story of the Woman at the Well. That Gospel story is always read in liturgical year A and is optional for years B and C. That story fits beautifully with the theme we have been pondering of Jesus' forty days in the desert.

First of all, the story takes place at noon, when most women remained inside at home to avoid the heat. The woman comes to the well during the heat of the day to avoid encountering other women, for fear of experiencing their judgment of her sinful life.

The story also has as a central theme the quenching of one's thirst, which we have also pondered this Lent as we looked at Jesus in the desert. When Jesus encounters this woman at the well, it is clear that she is physically thirsty; even more, she is spiritually thirsty. She sought to quench that thirst by marrying one man after another and then by living with someone who was not her husband. When Jesus sees her, He makes an interesting request of her with deep spiritual meaning. He simply says, "Give me a drink."

Cooperation and service at heart of priestly ministry, says Pope



In an address prepared for deacons preparing for priestly ordination, Pope Francis reflected on three aspects of priestly ministry highlighted in the rite of ordination: faithful cooperation with the Bishop, service to the people of God, and guidance by the Holy Spirit. Although a scheduled meeting was postponed on account of the Pope's health, the Holy Father's remarks were published on Saturday by the Holy See Press Office. Pope Francis reminded them, first of all, that the Church does not ask them primarily to be leaders, but to be cooperators with the Bishops. Priests, he said, are called to be witnesses to the "mystery of communion" that is the Church, especially through fraternity, fidelity, and docility. In short, he said, priests are meant to be members of a choir, "not soloists"; brothers in the presbyterate and priests for all, not only for a particular group.
